The HMIS Committee did not meet in December.

The HMIS Committee met in January, with the primary focus being preparing for an RFP process launching this summer. The committee plans to review various sections of the proposed RFP each month, with the goal of having a committee approved RFP available for board approval in July 2023. In June of this year the CoC will enter into our final year of a 5-year contract with Social Solutions for HMIS and is required to go into a procurement process for a new contract. The review timeline is attached to this report.

The HMIS Committee needs to be repopulated. Each CoC member agency has an HMIS point of contact. This point of contact, or an appropriate appointee, is being asked to attend the committee to participate in the RFP process. Additionally, the committee would welcome recommendations of professionals from other field who have experience with large databases. Please let Anthony Hogg know of recommendations.

Report

The ICT Committee did not meet in December.

In January the ICT Committee met and discussed a number of significant system topics. The Committee was updated on the additional Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHV) being provided by Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. TDHCA increased our allocation to 386, plus additional funds to help navigate the process and assist households with move-in costs. In phase 1, the plan is to prioritize families and move on efforts to create flow in our system and address the family crisis we continue to see. We will also allocate 20 to Parker County. As we move through the process and into phase 2, our system will have a better picture of how all of these will be used, but will have a significant impact on how many households we can house.

The quarterly dashboard was shared with committee members.

Shannon Barnes, Director of Training provided an update on training efforts this year. The Homeless Coalition has made the decision to do away with General Meeting and focus on more specific trainings for partners. With the CoC restructure a few years ago, there are many other meetings that provide a platform for information/resource sharing. The training schedule is attached.

The Committee discussed transfer enrollments and how to transfer households between programs when a different type of services or housing are needed. Scenarios were discussed and follow up information was provided.

The Planning team will share proposed PSH case management standards with ICT in February, with roll out to partners expected to be this summer.

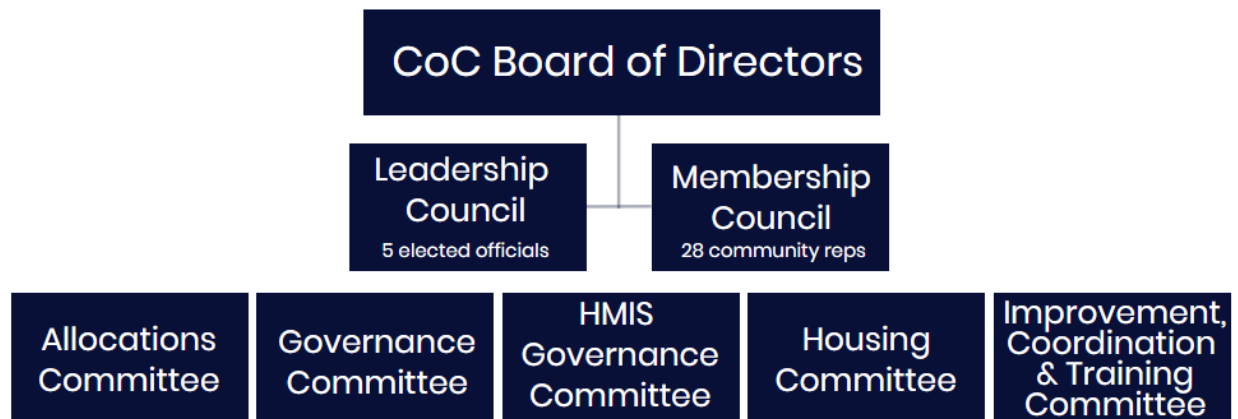

Committee Purpose and Alignment

Allocations

Purpose: The Allocations Committee aligns needs with resources, with the goal of increasing system dollars and improving performance across the homeless services system. This includes all services from prevention of homelessness and diversion all the way to emergency shelter and housing programs.

Strategic Plan Alignment: Goal 5: Committed Resources

Governance

Purpose: The Governance Committee conducts the annual nominations process for the CoC Board of Directors. Committee members must include three members of the Leadership Council and three members of the Membership Council.

HMIS Governance Committee

Purpose: The HMIS Governance Committee oversees the Homeless Information Systems Management, including planning, participation, selection, implementation and ongoing oversight of data systems such as ETO, Green River and Outreach Grid.

Strategic Plan Alignment: Goal 2: Data Driven Solutions

Housing Committee

Purpose: The Housing Committee makes recommendations to the CoC Board on the planning, CoC wide policies, procedures, implementation and oversight needed to ensure adequate housing stock and access for those at risk of or experiencing homelessness.

Improvement, Coordination & Training Committee

Purpose: The ICT Committee oversees the development and implementation of CoC-wide policies, processes and training and oversees all provider workgroups and special population ad hoc subcommittees.
