Report

The December meeting focused on ensuring enough resources are available to meet the 2,200 in 2022 goal and to reach and maintain functional zero of homelessness in the CoC.

The committee brainstormed how to overcome barriers identified to housing 2,200 in 2022. Potential options for the CoC include:

- Using ESG to master lease units so that people can move in more quickly
- Reaching out to private complexes and owners to take more people experiencing homelessness
- Reaching out to developers who requested letters of support from United Way and other nonprofits in their city applications or zoning applications and asking them to take more people experiencing homelessness.

The committee also reviewed our jurisdictions' investment in PSH compared to other major cities and their rates of homelessness and chronic homelessness.

- This showed a need for more jurisdiction investment in PSH and capital development to reduce homelessness.
- The committee reviewed the CoC's ARPA request to the jurisdictions for capital development.

In future meetings, the committee will review additional details about the CoC's ARPA requests and the resources needed to reach *and maintain* functional zero. The committee will also review ongoing progress on YHDP and prepare for a YHDP competition.

Key Takeaways

Jurisdictions in Tarrant County CoC have not invested as much in homelessness as other jurisdictions in Texas.

Reaching and maintaining functional zero in the CoC will be easier with additional capital investment.

I. LSA Completed

- Report called Stella, LSA data feeds into this report. Have to do this every year, hardest report we have to report.
- Were given the tools needed to fix errors in December. Working on the data cleanup throughout the year.
- Stella report does not include street outreach, skews the data. HUD does not want to include it
- Green River is going to try and implement these tools, so we do not have to export them every time.

II. HIC/PIT Next

- Bambi is working on the HIC- Housing Inventory Count
- PIT- did not do an unsheltered count this year. Only counting the individuals that were served in the shelters. Due the end of April/May

III. Ongoing talks with JPS and Green River data sharing

- Discussed sharing data and what benefits JPS will get.
- Next talk will be with Boston Healthcare for the Homeless, they will share how they have used it
- Clients would sign a release at JPS, providers would be able to see the clients' appointments and any medications they should be taking.
- \$55k sitting in reserves with Green River for this project, just needing to get JPS on board.

IV. Billing increase plan

- HMIS fees will more than likely increase this year.
- Increased for Homeless Coalition already- \$25k.
- 5% annual increase written into Social Solutions contract
- No longer waiting every 5 years to increase the HMIS fees, this will now be a yearly occurrence.
- Still have another 2–3-year contract with ETO, may look at switching to Green River after.

Report

ICT has moved to all in-person meetings, as of February.

February:

ICT met to review the Coordinated Community Plan for ending homelessness, related to the Youth Homeless Demonstration Project grant. Included was all information required by HUD and information on how the housing funding would be used and when a competition would be held. The Youth Committee and the Youth Action Board both approved the plan prior to submission to the Committee. ICT approved the plan as presented.

The new Housing Assessment Tool (HAT) went live on Feb 16. Very preliminary data was shared with the committee and a discussion on how this differed from what was previously being collected was had.

The Committee also discussed the CoC priority populations. Currently the priority populations (in order of rank) are: 1. Veterans 2. Youth 3. Families. The committee discussed how we use the priority populations now that we do not have a score for people experiencing homelessness. Committee also discussed whether or not the populations are in the correct priority order. We need more data before removing subpopulations as a factor in housing.

March:

Leadership training for managers- Shannon Barnes presented on the Homeless Coalition's Leadership Academy for managers. This is an area where our CoC could improve and agencies report needing support.

Housing Assessment numbers and data was shared.

Committee discussed need to push efforts to document chronicity in population. Soon there will be a large amount of PSH vouchers coming into the community and we do not have enough people chronicity proven or overall document ready

The Universal COC/ESG housing program application will launch on April 1.
