- Creating new units and way to reserve units for people exiting

Report

The Homeless Coalition successfully submitted the Housing Inventory Count and Point In Time Count to HUD at the end of April.

Committee discussed a mass data clean-up for overnight shelters; this would involve dismissing thousands of clients who have not been active in the system.

Moving HMIS Committee to Quarterly meetings

Committee discussed increase in HMIS cost. The Homeless Coalition's contract with Social Solutions includes a 5% increase in fees every year. Historically, this cost has not been passed onto agencies. The CoC increased fees for the first time in five years in 2021. The CoC needs to get on a regular increase schedule to keep up with contract increases. The current HMIS contract ends in 2024. We will need to put out an RFP for services.

Report

<u>April</u>

The committee discussed mental health and housing/housing case management standard of care. Concerns have been expressed from agencies that clients are becoming more acute and need a higher level of care when in housing. The Homeless Coalition Training Department is working with MHMR to provide training for case managers. Training will launch this summer.

Additionally, the committee discussed how to prioritize 23 new Emergency Housing Vouchers from Tarrant County.

May

The Committee had extensive discussion on the ICT dashboard. The committee would like to see monthly data and comparisons to last year for reference. Committee also discussed what data is most useful for partners.

Committee discussed housing prioritization and changing which populations are prioritized for housing. In looking at numbers, there are more families without options than veterans, and veterans have more housing subsidies set aside for them. The Committee voted to prioritize families going forward.

Shared housing was discussed, however there are many way and regulations that impact this type of housing when implementing. The Homeless Coalition will get guidance from HUD and will create a document to share with partners and use in training.
