

A SNAPSHOT OF HOMELESSNESS ON JANUARY 27, 2023





Who experienced homelessness










Daily average households





Our CoC has received national recognition for implementation of new and innovative programming to address homelessness.


HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

Secured \$64M to build housing for people exiting homelessness. In Partnership with Fort Worth, Tarrant County, and Arlington this will create nearly 500 new units available.

HOUSING ASSESSMENT

Worked with community partners to create a new Housing Assessment Tool to better understand who is experiencing homelessness and how we can best serve them. This helps ensure the best use of all housing resources available.

A place to call home



National Leader

- Led the nation in utilization of Emergency Housing Vouchers
 - Housed an additional 350 households
- Created innovative Landlord Engagement program
 - Partnered with 130 landlords
 - Have access to 12,500 units
- Created Benefits Team to serve across CoC
 - Secured \$350,000 in income
- Commitment to best practices
 - Created Leadership Academy
 - Trained 2,675 professionals




Housing Investment Commitment

- Arlington: \$4,000,000







Household Type


Felony Conviction

HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

SHARED HOUSING

Increase housing available through more than one person living together

QUALITATIVE DATA-

Focus on data driven decisions by integrating qualitiative data into analysis
